Our beautiful, award-winning Victorian mansion is located at 53 Marlborough Street in Boston's Back Bay. It is an ideal setting for weddings and other joyous occasions, for business meetings, seminars and presentations, association meetings, private dinner parties, wine tastings and more.

The French Library is available for rental Monday through Sunday from 9:00 AM to 10:00 PM. Availability is subject to the business needs of the French Library. We have a maximum standing capacity of 120 people. We can accommodate up to 80 for a seated dinner, and 60 people seated for a presentation or concert.



About the Building

Designed by architect Charles Brigham in 1867, the mansion later was the home of artist Katharine Lane Weems, sculptor of the graceful dolphin statue at the New England Aquarium. Ms. Weems gifted the building to the French Library in 1961.

A major renovation spanning from 2020 to 2022 preserved the building's architectural charm while modernizing the electrical, heating, cooling, plumbing and IT systems. The kitchen was upgraded to demonstration standards, and the building was made fully accessible. We have twelve separate spaces within the building available for rent.

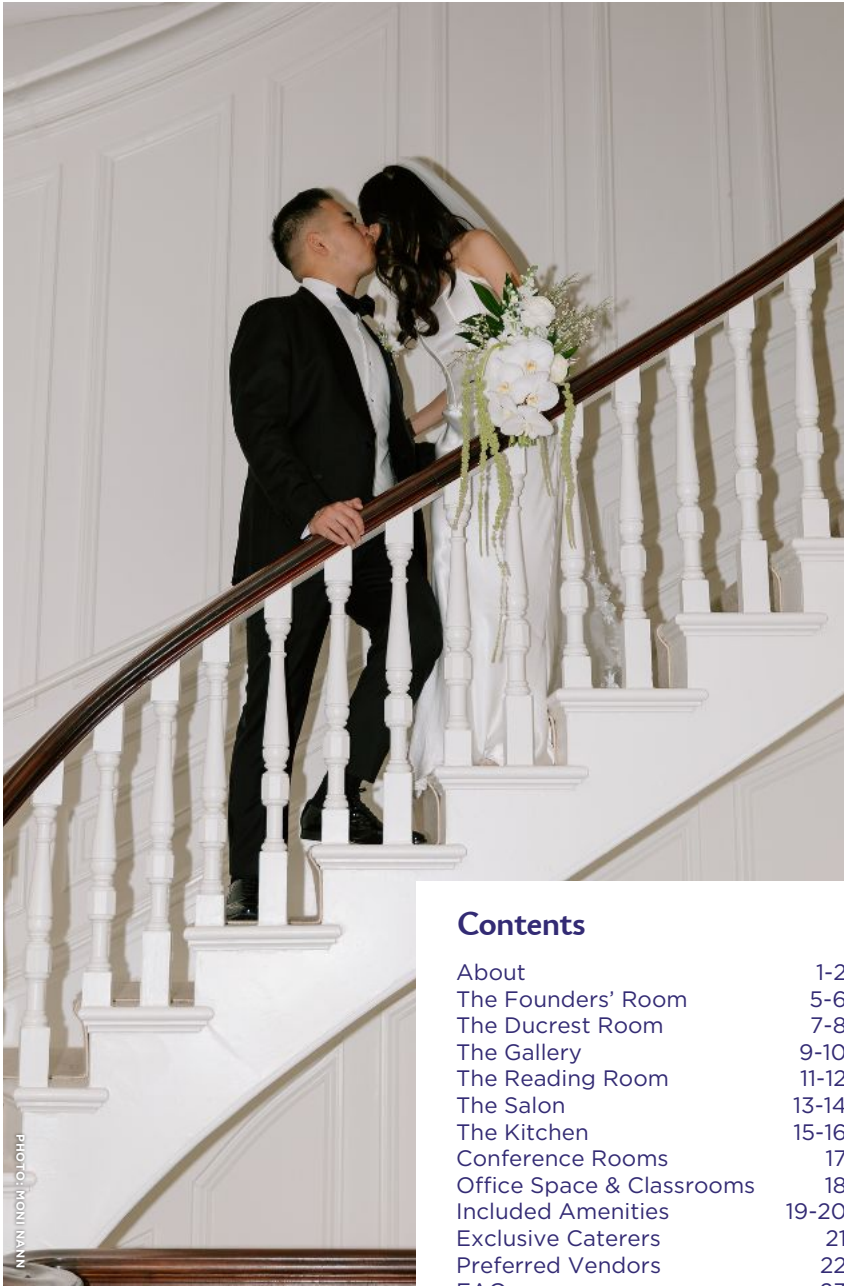

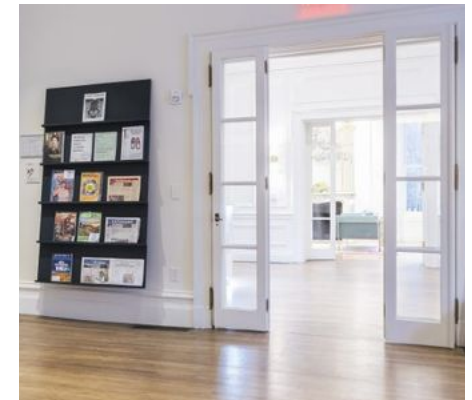
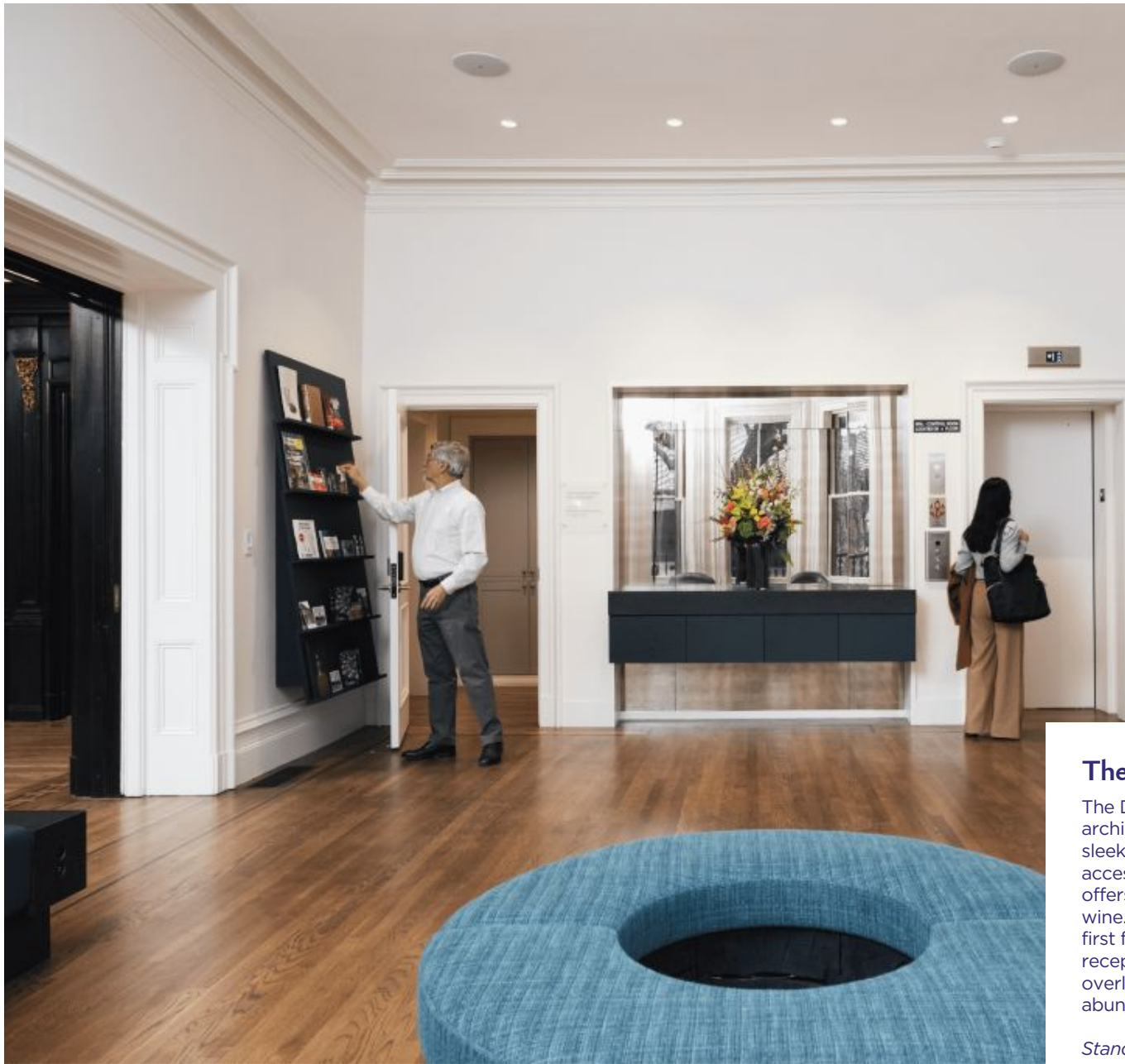
The Founders' Room

The historic Founders' Ballroom was expressly constructed to house its wooden *boiserie* walls and gold detailing, imported from a Belgian chapel. It is the main event space of the French Library, hosting lectures, performances, dinners, meetings, and many other soirées. Perfect for a wide array of upscale gatherings, the Founders' Room has a Steinway grand piano and is fully equipped with speakers and an A/V system.

Seated dinner: 48 guests

The Ducrest Room

The Ducrest Family Magazine Room blends Victorian architecture with modern French design to create a sleek and comfortable ambiance. With direct elevator access to the kitchen on the garden floor, the space offers convenience for caterers to transport food and wine. Paired with the adjoining Founders' Room on the first floor, the Ducrest Room is a perfect location for a reception, bar, or book signing. With large windows overlooking Marlborough Street, the space boasts an abundance of natural light.

Standing reception: 15 guests

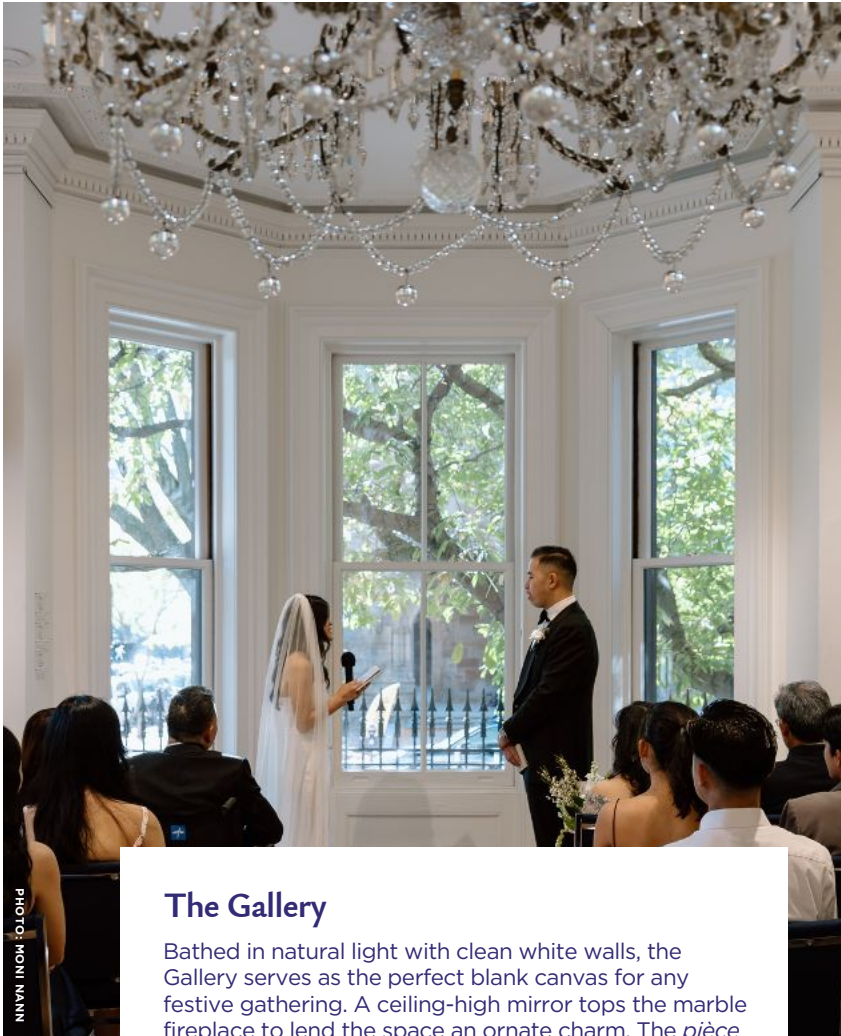

The Gallery

Bathed in natural light with clean white walls, the Gallery serves as the perfect blank canvas for any festive gathering. A ceiling-high mirror tops the marble fireplace to lend the space an ornate charm. The *pièce de résistance* of the room is its antique crystal chandelier that was formerly lit by candlestick. The French doors to the Gallery can be closed, making it an intimate location for private events and parties. As its namesake implies, the Gallery is also available for small exhibition events.

Seated dinner: 30 guests



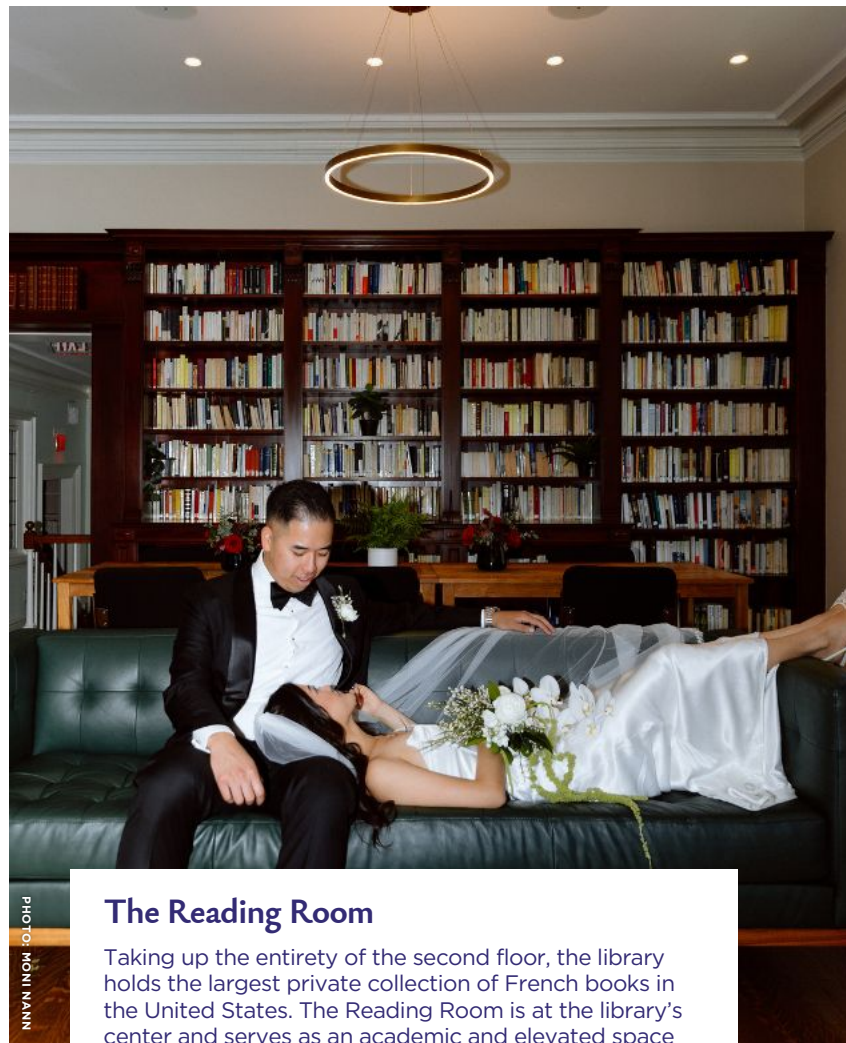

The Reading Room

Taking up the entirety of the second floor, the library holds the largest private collection of French books in the United States. The Reading Room is at the library's center and serves as an academic and elevated space perfect for receptions, conferences, and cozy parties. The Reading Room is adorned with antique wooden bookcases on all sides. A light and airy space, the room has large windows overlooking a charming view of the corner of Marlborough and Berkeley Street.

The Salon

The Salon boasts a decidedly modern aesthetic, featuring parquet flooring, champagne-tinted wallpaper, and a dramatic pendant light from French designer Constance Guisset. Located within the library on the second floor, the room is the perfect space for hosting an intellectual *salon*, small private dinner or standing reception. With direct access to the elevator, the Salon is convenient, private, and offers a distinguished, French feel that elevates any occasion.

Seated dinner: 20 guests

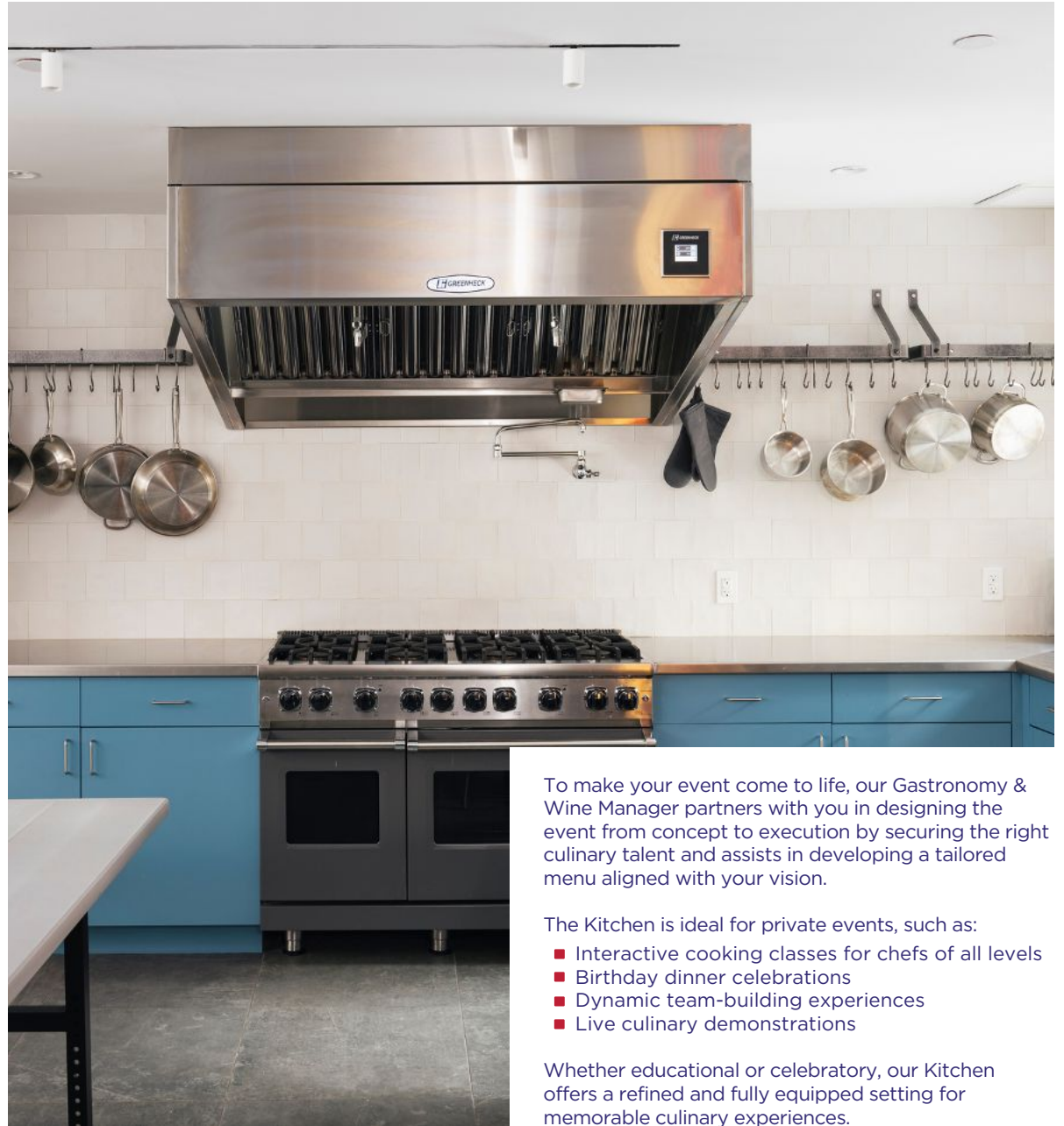

Located on the garden floor, the state-of-the-art Kitchen is equipped with a commercial-grade stove, industrial fridge, versatile mobile demonstration table, and stainless-steel countertops. It is the perfect place to hold private events and is conveniently located next to our two-sided elevator for easy catering accessing.

The French Library contains five classrooms available for rent across the first, third, and fourth floors. The Mormoris-Cornell Room, the Massard-McComb Room, the Saint-Exupéry Room, the Victor Hugo Room and the Berkeley Room are all perfect spaces for board meetings and presentations alike. With SMART Boards in each room and flexible table arrangements, the classrooms are versatile settings for any small event.

FAQs

What are the rental fees?

Fees are calculated by room, day of the week, season, and number of hours. Available upon request.

Do you have hour restrictions?

The French Library is available for rental from 9am to 10pm Monday through Sunday, subject to the departmental needs of the cultural center. All private events have a 4-hour minimum, including 1-hour set-up and 1-hour breakdown. Due to Back Bay noise ordinances, all events must end by 10pm, with load out finished by 11pm.

Is your building handicap accessible?

Yes, the French Library is fully ADA accessible, with multifloor elevators and handicap bathrooms.

Is parking available for guests?

There is no private parking at the French Library. Metered parking is available on the street. Discounted parking is available at the Boston Common Parking Garage on Saturdays all day and on weekdays after 4pm for \$12. Please contact rentals@frenchlibrary.org for more information.

Are candles allowed?

Per Boston Fire Department regulations, no open flames are allowed on the premises. Electric votives are welcomed and encouraged.

Do you offer rentals for 1-hour wedding ceremonies?

The French Library does not currently offer 1-hour wedding ceremony rental packages.

Can we take wedding photos throughout the building?

Depending on availability, wedding parties are welcome to take photos throughout all of our spaces.

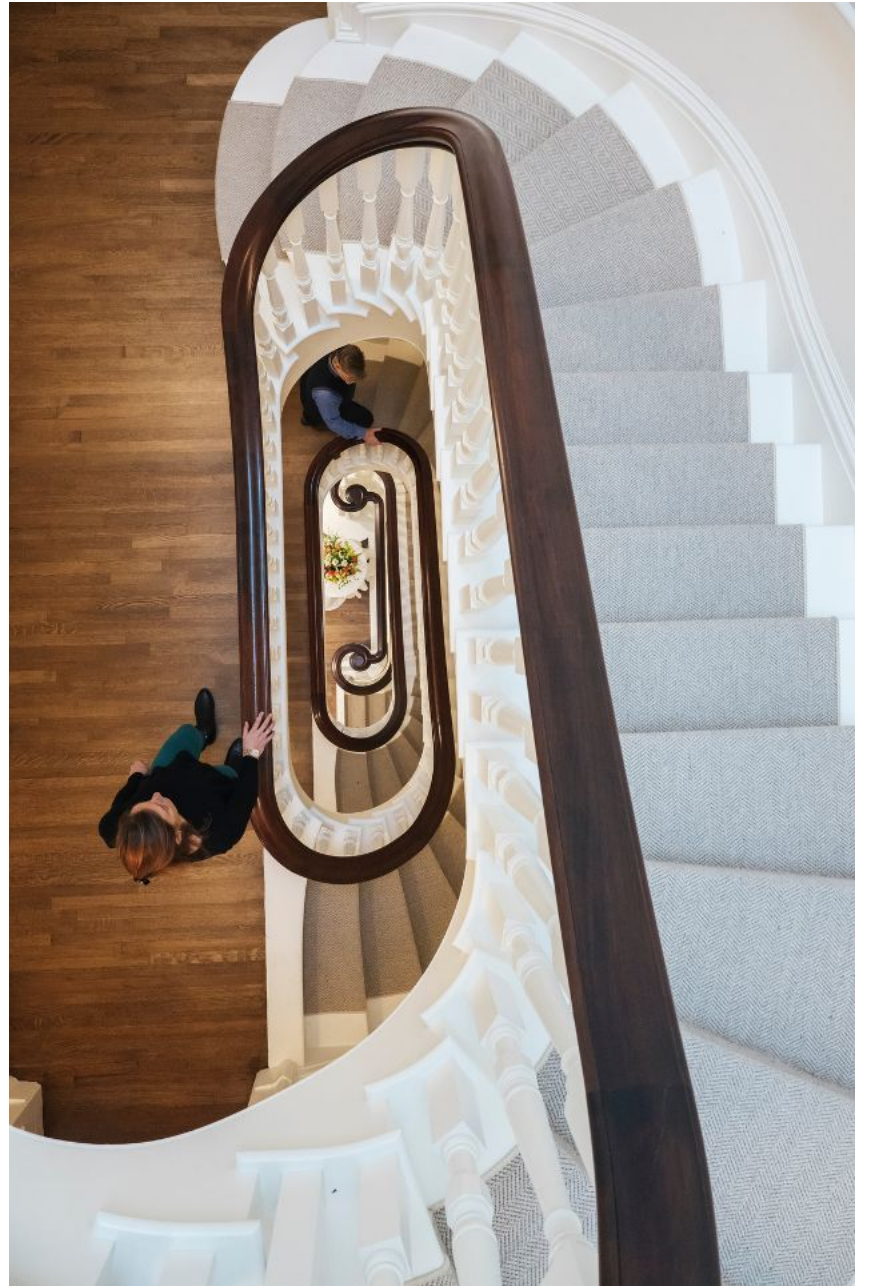
Is the French Library available as a filming location?
